Boadicea is a dwarf variety and is the only variety which is resistant to aphids. It was bred as a dual purpose variety with moderate alpha and good flavour. Thus, it could be used in organic beers where only limited ranges of hops are available. Boadicea is named after a celtic warrior queen who resisted the Roman invasion centuries ago, like the hop plant resists aphids. A mellow citrus flavour with a light flowery aroma and a light lime-like aroma give this variety a pleasant taste.
